## SUMMARY OF TEACHING EVALUATIONS for Nhat-Dang Do

The attached summaries of teaching evaluations are based on confidential responses to questionnaires provided to students enrolled in courses and discussion sections taught by the above-named individual. Evaluations were conducted either by CAPE, UCSD's student-run course evaluation organization; the Political Science Department at UCSD; or the Political Science Department at USD, as indicated on summaries. Departmental evaluation forms ask students to assess the individual in response to eleven statements (Likert agreement scale), one scale question on TA speaking speed, and in open-ended comments. These summaries report the percent strongly agree/agree to each of the eleven applicable statements and a survey of student comments.
